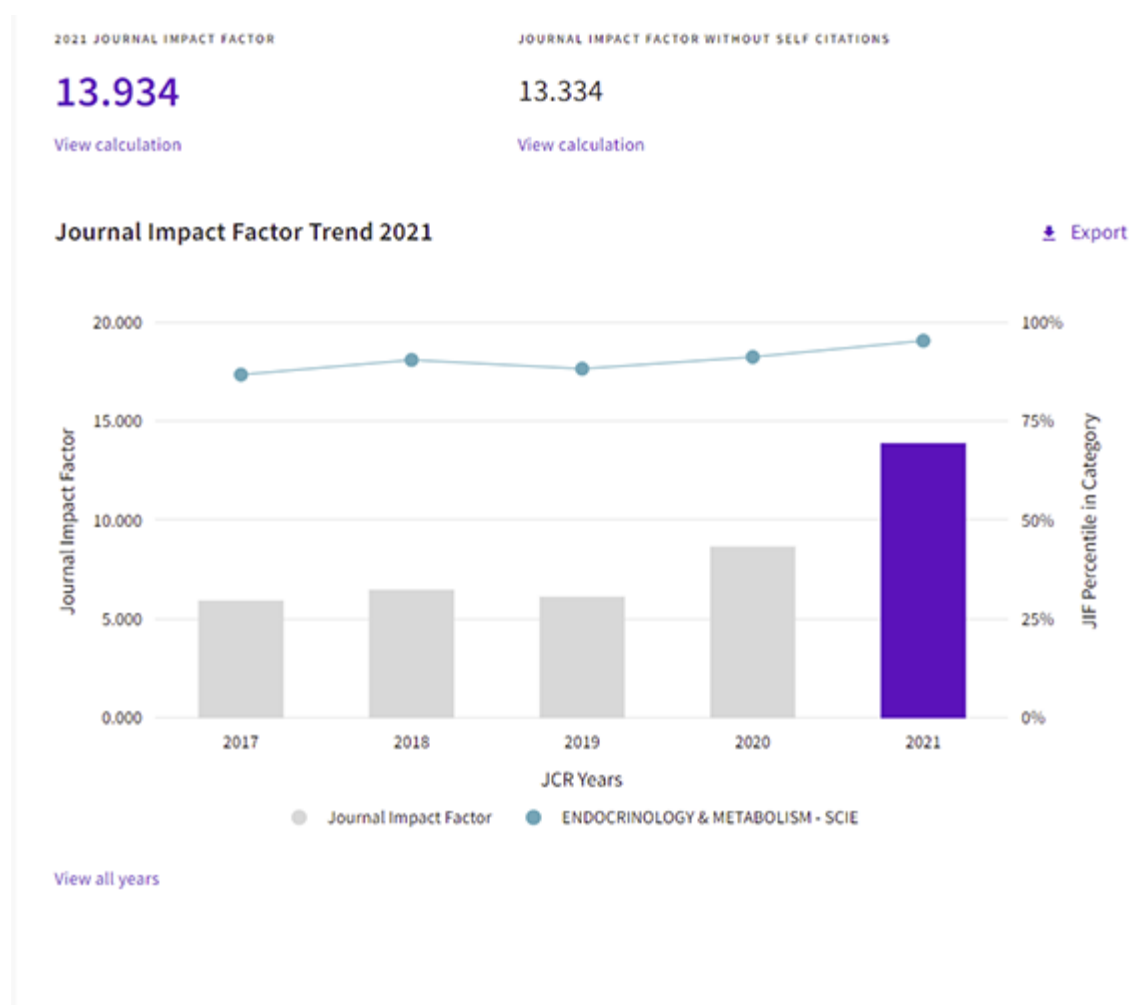


Dear Friends and Colleagues,
