Dr. Davidson is one of the charter members of the American Association of Clinical Endocrinologists (AACE) and Past President of WorldWIDE Diabetes, a not-for-profit diabetes education foundation.

He has published numerous book chapters and more than 250 articles in scientific journals, and serves on several Editorial Boards: Clinical Diabetes and Endocrinology, *Journal of Diabetes*, the *Journal of the Mexican Society of Nutrition and Endocrinology*, US Endocrinology, etc.

He was a member of the National Diabetes Advisory Board and served in several advisory positions at the CDC.

Dr. Davidson served as chair of the Texas Diabetes Council, Texas Department of Health. Council Member at the Texas Department of Health Services. For the International Diabetes Federation he served in the Task Force on Epidemiology, chaired the New Onset Diabetes after Transplantation guidelines and served in the Post Prandial Guidelines Committee.

He is a fellow of the American College of Physicians and a Master of the American College of Endocrinology. He chaired the first American College of Endocrinology Guidelines on Glycemic Control and served in several occasions as an advisor to the Board of Directors of the American Association of Endocrinologists. Dr. Davidson served as a member of the board for several years.

He has served as President of the Endocrine & Diabetes Associates of Texas and has been on the Board of Directors of the American Diabetes Association (ADA).

Among his numerous awards, Professor Davidson has received the ADA's Harold Rifkin Award and the AACE's Outstanding Service Award for the Promotion of Endocrine Health of an Underserved Population. He has also been the recipient of the ADA Elmo Brown Award for Outstanding Service in the Area of Public Awareness, the Bernardo Alberto Houssay Award for Minority Health, and the American College of Endocrinology Yank Coble Award for his contributions to Endocrinology.

Dr. Davidson is an Honorary member of the Mexican Academy of Medicine and also of several Latin American Endocrinology Associations and as an advisor to the Latin Diabetes Association where he is an honorary member.

Dr. Davidson is the co-director of "Curso Intensivo de Diabetes, Endocrinología y Enfermedades Metabólicas" a unique CME program all in Spanish with a US University based faculty. The event is held yearly in Miami, FL and December 2018 will mark the number XX.
